

History

Harrison was named after Harrison Gray Otis of Boston and was taken from the towns of Bridgton and Otisfield. The town was originally called Pondicherry, in 1805 the part of Bridgton laying on the east side pf Long Pond containing about 8500 acres was taken off to form the new town of Harrison and untied with the west side part of the Crooked River in Otisfield. The town was incorporated in March 8, 1805.

Built in 1824/25 by Rev. Clement Phinney
Bought by John Johnson and Sold to Benjamin Foster 1830
Benjamin Foster sells to Henry Buck in 1831
Henry Buck sells to his son Adelbert Buck in 1893
Adelbert Buck sells to son Leland Buck in 1919
Leland Buck sells to daughter Madelyn Buck in 1979
Madelyn was the last Buck to live here she passed away in 2017

The Buck Farm was owned by the Buck Family for approximately 186 years

After Adelbert bought the Farm he build a new barn and attached it to the house replacing the ramshackle barn across the road. He also modernized the house and added a second floor at this time.

Notes:

Rev. Clement Phinney and Joanna Wallace were married 3/3/1803. They moved to Harrison 1824/25 & built what is now known as the Buck Farm. He preached at the Free Will Baptist Church in Harrison, Maine and preached all over mostly revivals type services. He Moved to Buckfield in approx. 1830 and lived there for 2-3 years. Clements's grandfather was Colonel Edmund Phinney's Thirty-first regiment of foot Revolutionary War and Eighteenth continental regiment, twelve months' service in 1776. Edmund Phinney's father John Phinney was the founder of Gorham, Maine where there is a rock called Phinney rock marked John Phinney May 26, 1736. Captain John Phinney had served in the French and Indian Wars and was granted 30 acres in Gorhamtown for his grandfather Johns service in King Philips War.

Notes:

(Key Code *WBMN + went by middle name) Henry Buck and Ruth Ingalls were married on 10/20/1843. Henry Buck came to Harrison about 1831 and bought the Clement Phinney Farm now known as the Buck Farm owned by the Buck family for approx. 186 years. Son Judge George Buck worked his way up to being a Superior Court Judge in CA. George served as DA for 8 years, County Judge for 42 years (1890-1932) hearing approx. 20,000 cases. Son Norman Buck was a lawyer in NM and was working on a case against shoemaker Otter Johnson. They met on the street, exchanged words and Otter shot and killed Norman.

(Key Codes *WBMN + went by middle name) (*NM never married) (*PPSL private person still living) Leland Buck Sr. and Lula Haskell were married on 4/5/1916. Son Emebert Buck served in WWII and the Korean War he retired from the military as a Army Captain. Son 2nd. Lt. Leland Buck Jr. who served in WWII was Killed in action in Shanghai. He was co-pilot of a B-24 on his second mission with the 63 bombardment Squadron, 43 Bomber Group H Squadron of the Seahawk Squadron. Madelyn Buck was a teacher and had traveled to Venezuela to tutor wealthy businessmen's children. She retired in 1982 and returned to the Buck Farm to care for her ailing parents and was the last Buck to live there passing away in 2017. The Buck families had occupied that home for approx. 186 years.
