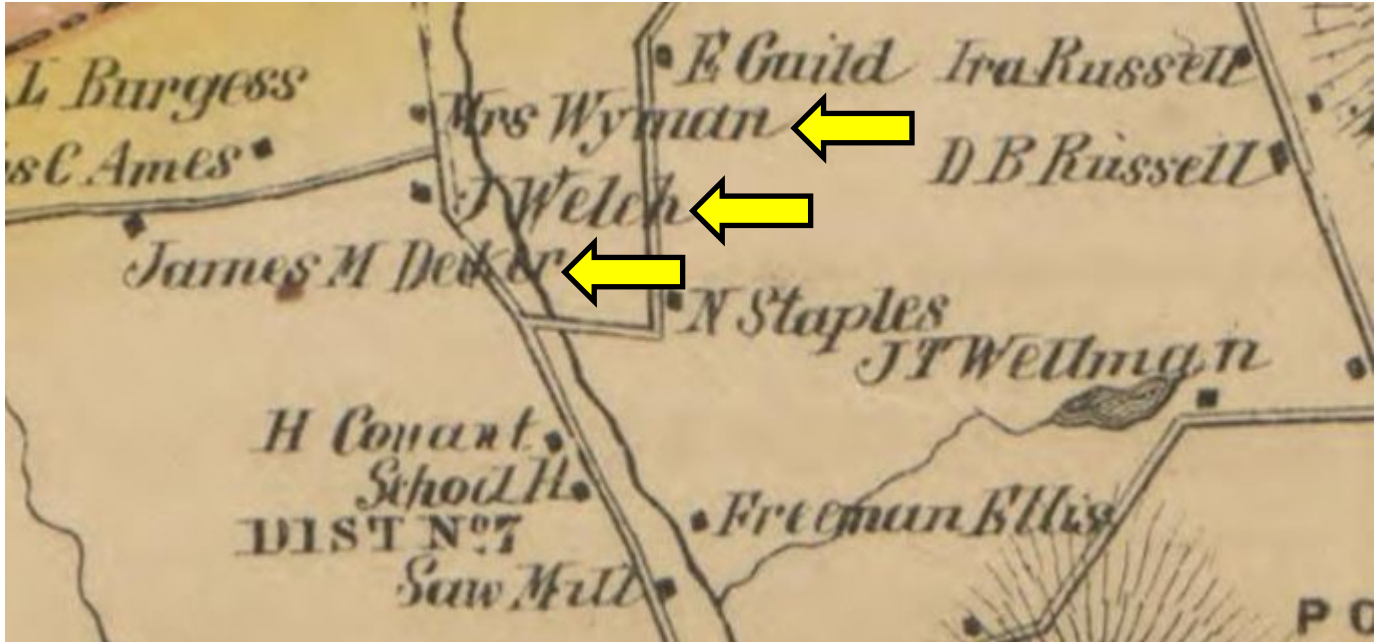

## Temple, Maine

Temple, Maine was named after Temple, New Hampshire where some of the first settlers came from. Settled in the beginning of 1796 and incorporated on June 20, 1803.

### Bracket Wyman and Sarah Conant's family in the military

Brackett and Sarah's son Abraham Wyman was in the Civil War a Union Private, Company C, 32nd Regiment, Maine Infantry. Abraham was captured in the Virginia wilderness and was reported missing in action on 5/6/1864. He died of SCORBUTUS which was scurvy as a prisoner at Andersonville Prison GA. Andersonville Prison commonly known as Camp Sumter was in operation for 14 months there were 45,000 union soldiers imprisoned there and nearly 13,000 died from disease, poor sanitation, malnutrition or exposure. The prison was liberated by the Union Army in May 1865, with the prisoners inside being described as walking skeletons. Abraham is buried at Andersonville National Cemetery.

Bracket's Grandfather Daniel Wyman was a private in the American Revolutionary War in Capt. Samuel McCobb & Col. John Nixon, 5 Regt.

Sarah Conant's uncle Abraham Conant was in Capt. J Weed's Co. & Lieut. Col. E Foots Reg. War of 1812. The War of 1812 was fought by the United States and Great Britain primarily over British Violations of United States maritime rights.

Sarah's grandfather Ephraim Conant took part in the Battle of Lexington and was a private in the American Revolutionary War in Capt. William Whitcomb Co & Col. James Prescott Regt. The "Shot Heard 'Round the World" is a phrase that refers to the opening shots of the battles of Lexington and Concord which sparked the American Revolutionary War.

Mary Churchill's dad William Churchill served in the Revolutionary War under Captain Calvin Partridge and Lieut. - Col. Samuel Pierce's Regiment. Marched May 21, 1779 and was stationed at Little Compton RI.

### 32nd Regiment, Maine Infantry

OVERVIEW: Organized at Augusta March 3 to May 6, 1864. 6 Companies left State for Washington, D. C., April 20. 4 Companies left State for Washington May 11 and joined Regiment at North Anna River, Va., May 26. Attached to 2nd Brigade, 2nd Division, 9th Army Corps, Army of the Potomac, to December, 1864.

SERVICE: Campaign from the Rapidan to the James River, Va., May 3-June 15, 1864. Battles of the [Wilderness](#) May 5-7. [Spottsylvania](#) May 8-12. Spottsylvania C. H. May 12-21. [North Anna River](#) May 23-26. On line of the Pamunkey May 26-28. [Totopotomoy](#) May 28-31. [Cold Harbor](#) June 1-12. Bethesda Church June 1-3. Before Petersburg June 16-19. Siege of [Petersburg](#) June 16, 1864, to December 12, 1864. [Mine Explosion](#), Petersburg, July 30. Weldon R. R. August 18-21. Poplar Springs Church September 29-October 2. [Boydton Plank Road](#), Hatcher's Run, October 27-28. Consolidated with 31st Maine Infantry December 12, 1864.

Regiment lost during service 4 Officers and 81 Enlisted men killed and mortally wounded, and 3 Officers and 114 Enlisted men by disease. Total 202.

WYMAN, DANIEL, Pownalborough. Certificate dated Cambridge, June 24, 1775, signed by Capt. Samuel McCobb, certifying that said Wyman and others belonging to his company, Col. Nixon's regt., were in need of cartridge boxes and that each had received one, for which said McCobb promised to be accountable; also, Private, Capt. McCobb's co., Col. John Nixon's regt.; muster roll dated Aug. 1, 1775; enlisted June 1, 1775; service, 2 mos. 5 days.

WYMAN, DANIEL. Lists of men returned as having voluntarily enlisted into the army in 1775, and also in 1776, and men supposed to have enlisted into the army for 3 years but not returned to the town, annexed to a petition of the inhabitants of Winthrop, dated March 10, 1777, asking consideration on account of their exposed condition.

He moved to Georgetown, Mass., thence to Temple, N. H., where his name appears in a list of inhabitants, 1784 (N. H. Town Papers, Vol. 13, p. 561), thence to Thomaston, Me., and finally settled in Temple, Me., as a farmer. He d. in Temple, Me., 22 Jan., 1826. He m. in Temple, N. H., Rebecca Hayward.

Born in Middleboro' in 1755, and lived there until after the war of the Revolution, in which he served, in the Company of Capt. Calvin Partridge, Lieut.-Col. Samuel Pierce's Regiment. Marched May 21, 1779, and was stationed at Little Compton, R.I. Some time before 1784 he settled in Buckfield, Me. About 1796 or 1797 he removed to Wayne, Me. He drew a pension for his service in the Revolution, according to the account of one of his grandsons. Married, in Middleboro', Mass., LYDIA MAXIM.
