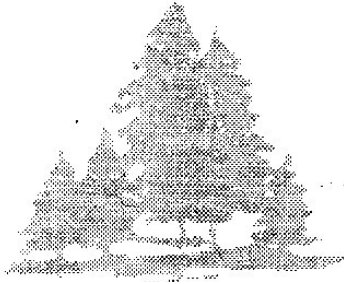

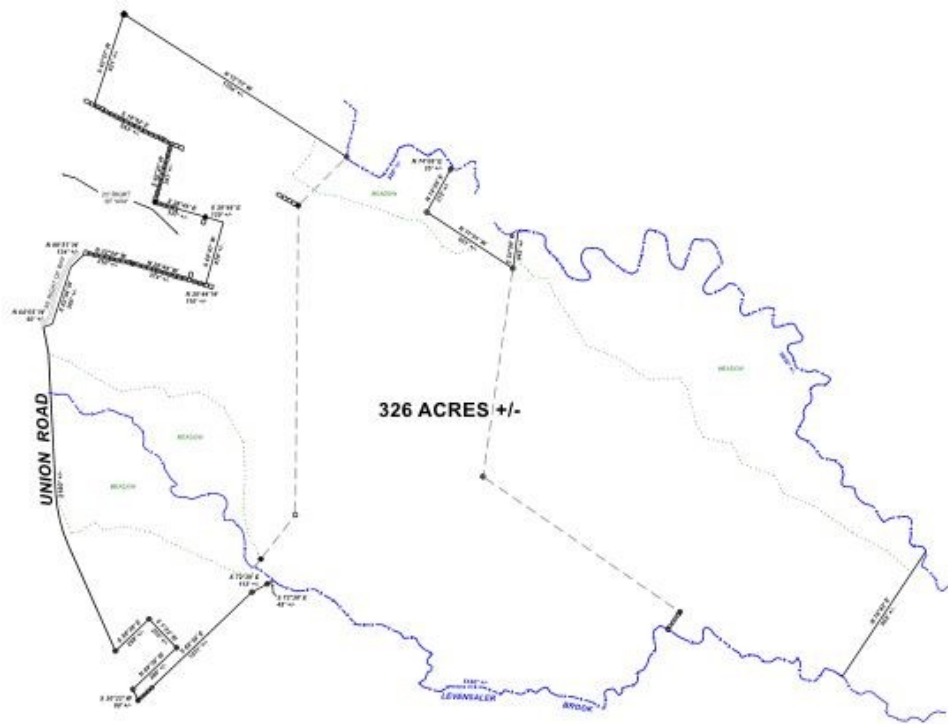

## Schwartz/Black

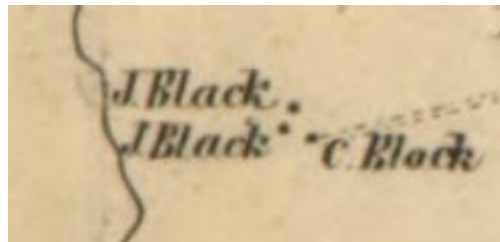
Variations on the Schwartz name spelling are many here are some Schwartz, Schwartzs, Schwarz, Swatz, Swartz, Swarts, Swatts, Swats.

They immigrated from Germany and did not speak English. They settled in what is known as Broad bay. On June 29, 1773 the Plantation of Broad Bay was incorporated and the town became Waldoborough named after General Samuel Waldo.

After the close of the Indian Wars and Revolution the family moved to the northeastern part of Waldoboro and the settlement was called Blacktown. The Schwartz name meaning in German is Black or dark. They changed their name to Black which is a Americanized version of their name. You will find old records where they used both Schwartz and Black.

 in the State of Maine aged thirty two years,  
 and by occupation a farmer Do HEREBY ACKNOWLEDGE to have  
 volunteered this Twenty third day of January 1865  
 to serve as a Soldier in the Army of the United States of America, for the period  
 of One Year unless sooner discharged by proper authority: Do also  
 agree to accept such bounty, pay, rations, and clothing, as are, or may be, estab-  
 lished by law for volunteers. And I, Morton A. Blackinton do  
 solemnly swear, that I will bear true faith and allegiance to the United States  
of America, and that I will serve them honestly and faithfully against all their  
 enemies or opposers whomsoever; and that I will observe and obey the orders of  
 the President of the United States, and the orders of the officers appointed over  
 me, according to the Rules and Articles of War.
